From the Principal's Desk...

Issue 9

Clarinda Primary School is a traditional educational setting with modern approaches: our instructional models reflecting the significant technological developments and societal changes over the years. In the past education was delivered through recitation and memorisation techniques, with the modern way of doing things involving more interactive methods, development of critical thinking, along with problem solving and decisionmaking opportunities. Twenty-first-century schooling encourages students to collaborate, be more involved in their own learning, and therefore be more productive.

At CPS we continue to make considered efforts to improve the way that we work with our students and their parents to improve students' learning. In an approach that reflects the intention of the Victorian Curriculum we're mindful in creating contexts for students to be actively involved in their learning and assessment of their progress. As Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) at CPS, teachers collaboratively map student's learning against the achievement standards, and individually place each student on the learning continuum, to best reflect the student's level of performance and progress.

Along with developing student voice and agency, assessment and reporting are vital processes which provide information about what students know and can do, and makes recommendations for future learning. Teachers collect, record and analyse information about student learning on a daily basis and use this information to (i) identify a student's learning strengths, weaknesses and needs; (ii) plan programs building on the prior knowledge and learning that a student brings to school; and (iii) inform the child, parents and other teachers about the student's learning.



From the Principal's Desk...

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Building on Parent Teacher Interviews from Term 1, this outline gives you an idea of the ways that we will report to you as parents about your child(ren)'s achievement for the remainder of 2024:

- Individual Written Reports: at both the end of Semester 1 and the end of Term 4 you will receive a published report that provides a succinct written summary of your child/ren's progress as well as a measurement of the <u>core curriculum areas</u> on a 5-point scale. This learning continuum is organised by levels and not necessarily year levels of schooling, as students' progress along the continuum at their own rate and from their own starting point, and are taught at the level appropriate to their needs.
- Parent Teacher Interviews: Following distribution of reports later this month (Friday 21st June), we will be holding interviews on Tuesday 25th June. These meetings are a forum for learning to be discussed between children, their parents/caregivers, and teachers. The aim of these interviews is to celebrate successes with the opportunity for the parents and teacher to highlight strengths, consider current achievement and identify next learning steps. Bookings are open (via Compass Community Conferences).

Parent Voluntary Contributions: A reminder to parents/caregivers about the next installment of contributions is now due.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has and will continue to make a made a huge difference to the resourcing of our school, as we don't want your child missing out!

The facilities and the programs we can offer your children, due to these contributions, has a significant impact on the success and enjoyment of your children's education.

Your contribution allows us to organise and coordinate the best possible programs outside of the traditional teaching and learning classroom structure.

These financial contributions assist us with the purchase of art, music, information technology (iPads and Laptops) and physical education equipment and resources. Other programs which we can offer due to your contributions include the Art Show, Student Choir, Junior Rock Band, Perceptual Motor Program and Welfare programs such as 'Play is the Way' and Breakfast Club.





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From the Principal Desk... Thumbs Up:

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- **Report writing:** What a busy time of the year it is. With less than a month of Term 2 left our students and teachers are busy working their way through the last components of our Semester 1 Assessment Schedule in preparation for report writing. Assessing, analysing, moderating and then writing reports takes many hours and we're appreciative the parents who honour this commitment having already made a conference booking.
- **Staff:** We deeply appreciate the time our teaching staff commit to planning, preparing and implementing extracurricular events (beyond the core work of teachers as required for the standard Victorian Curriculum) for our students. The provision of extracurricular opportunities necessitates massive logistical and administrative workload to meet the vast compliance and duty of care requirements for every event and activity. This is required before we can even start to offer these opportunities to our students. It is fact, that our teachers often sacrifice significant amounts of their personal time to provide these opportunities for our students.
- School Disco: Our PACC are offering a P-2 and Gr 3-6 Disco next Friday 21st June. This will be the first time an event like this has been offered to our community for many years. Parent volunteers are required and so far 15 out 16 spots have been filled (thank you). I would like to remind volunteers to provide the administration office with a copy of your Working with Children Check prior to the event.

- Excursions and Bus Costs: We would like to inform parents and carers that the cost of hiring buses for excursions and sports continues to be a challenge. It does concern us to see these increases and we always shop around for good value across the range of companies we normally use. Rest assured there is no compromise on the quality of the buses we hire which are all seat belted. If a child does not attend an excursion or event due to illness and where we have not incurred costs, we will refund that money. This is decided on a case-by-case basis but if transport is arranged we cannot credit this as buses and many providers will often not change the prearranged costings and we are obliged to pay even if a student does not attend.
- Student Free Days: Our remaining Curriculum Days for the year are **Friday 26th July** and **Monday 4th November** (Melbourne Cup Day Eve).


