From the Principal's Desk...

School tours for 2026 enrolments have commenced, and something we take for granted what is noticed by our visitors in the calm classrooms and orderly environments.

Reflecting on Attitude to School Survey data from the 2024 Cohort of Gr 4-6 students, it was noted:

Factor	Clarinda PS	Similar Schools	State
Attitude to Attendance	95%	87%	85%
Sense of Confidence	94%	84%	83%
Sense of Connectedness	94%	80%	77%
Stimulated Learning	91%	79%	77%
Effective Classroom Behaviour	93%	78%	77%
Differentiate Learning Challenges	95%	78%	77%

Good classroom management is a strong skill of the teachers at CPS and is critical for success. One thing all teachers (and adults) want is for our children to learn to manage their own behaviour. By teaching thinking tools and organisational strategies, the students learn to take control and responsibility for their learning.

Student Engagement and Wellbeing

As stated in our Student Engagement and Wellbeing Policy: 'All members of our school community have a right to experience a safe and supportive school environment. We expect that all students, staff, parents and carers treat each other with respect and dignity. At 8:40am, a teacher is on 'yard duty' and therefore supervision is provided from this time onwards. We are concerned by the number of students arriving at school without a parent as early as 8:10am! Whilst we understand that some parents have work commitments that require them to leave for work earlier than 8:40am you need to plan for your child. Camp Australia offers an excellent Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) program to support our families.

- Emergency Evacuation Drill Thursday 20th March @ 12:35pm As part of our Emergency Management Plan, we perform numerous scenarios throughout the school year to ensure staff and students are familiar with expectations of emergency events. Today, every person on the school grounds at 12:35pm participated in an evacuation to the oval.
- Traffic Safety: A reminder that Eulinga Road and Crawford Road 'Kiss and Go' parking requires parents to stay with their cars at all times. Even though the school year is young, we cannot help but notice the amount of times parents ignore the signage around the school, particularly stopping in nostanding areas near driveways and street corners. The signs are there to ensure the safety of the students in our care and it's not good enough to simply ignore them by thinking you'll only be stopped for a minute. It obscures the sight lines of pedestrians and drivers alike and puts members of the community at risk. Please note: the school has no control over parking fines, but we do know that council officers patrol from time to time.
